EDUCATION

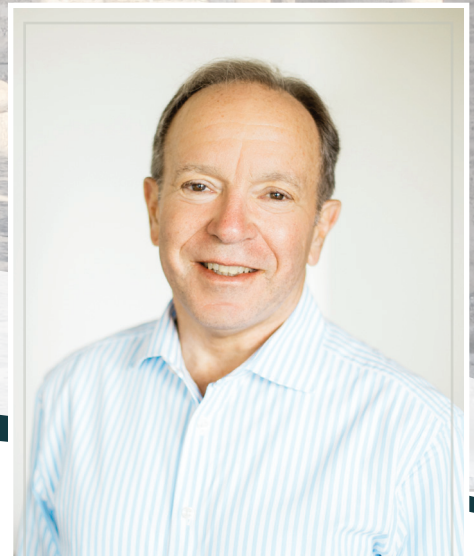
